Project Title: Medicaid Disenrollment: Plan Choices, Care Outcomes, and Financial Health Among Patients with Opioid Use Disorder

Project Description: Nearly 25 million individuals have lost their Medicaid coverage due to the end of the Medicaid continuous coverage protections put in place during the public health emergency; and about a quarter of those who lost Medicaid coverage have enrolled in private health insurance. This unfolding public health crisis will likely lead to disruptions to care, increased morbidity and mortality, and worsened financial health; especially among individuals who have an opioid use disorder. Using a unique database composed of all-payer claims data linked with credit report data, this research project will evaluate the impact of transitions from Medicaid to private health insurance on healthcare utilization, mortality, and financial well-being; specifically among patients diagnosed with an opioid use disorder.
